Join us for a lucky leprechaun story time. We'll share stories, songs, and games and even find a tasty treat (peanut free) at the end of the rainbow.

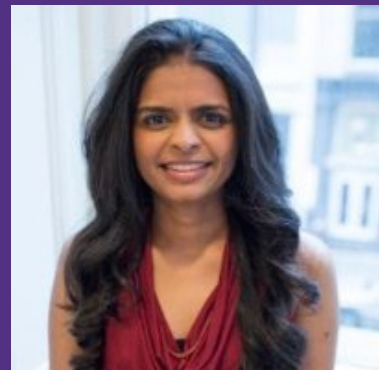
